A Farewell for Helen - by Clare Archer

The wake for Helen Hendry took place on Thursday, October 2nd at the Manly Skiff Club, attended by more than 50 of her family, friends and members of Sailability. The event was a simple and heartfelt gathering, just as Helen had requested, with no fuss or formality.

Helen's eldest son Peter shared a touching eulogy that reflected on her life, describing her as a loving, kind, and selfless presence. He also recounted anecdotes from Helen's younger days when she spent time living and working Europe. While working with the Australian High Commission, she was sent to Scotland and, to her surprise, was introduced by the local mayor as "Miss Australia"—a playful ruse that everyone in the town happily went along with in those pre-internet days.

Following Peter's words, Eli from Sailability Manly spoke about Helen's decades of dedication to the organisation, after being introduced to it by her husband. Helen duly acquired her power boat license and spent many a morning behind the wheel of *Charlie's Charlot*, and later took over the role of membership secretary. In a fitting tribute, Warwick announced that Sailability Manly would be naming their new boat *Helen Hendry*, in her favourite colour - yellow - ensuring her legacy sails on in the community she loved.








